

Behaviour Support System Redesign

Re-aligning for better care

The SGS program continues to lead the BSS redesign project in North Simcoe Muskoka with the goal to create a single integrated BSS team.

Phase 1

Phase 1 of BSS redesign was completed on June 1, 2017:

- BSS leadership was moved to the NSM SGS program, with Annalee King established as the new Manager of the BSS program.
- Waypoint's Behaviour Intervention Response Team (BIRT) was disbanded and resources were moved into the BSS team to provide more specialized care;
- County of Simcoe resources were redesigned to ensure BSS team members spend more time in NSM Long-Term Care Homes to provide just-in-time support to staff and residents; and,
- The number of BSS teams was expanded from three to five to align with the NSM LHIN sub-regions: Barrie, Couchiching, Muskoka, North Simcoe and South Georgian Bay.



During Phase 1, BSS staff knowledge, skills and judgment continued to be expanded through education and mentorship.

Phase 2

Phase 2 is focused on the continued redesign of Central Intake and on the role of other BSS team members:

Psychogeriatric Resource Consultants (PRC)

The PRC role was established in 1999 as part of the provincial strategy for Alzheimer Disease and Related Dementias (ADRD). The three NSM PRCs have provided education and mentorship to health service providers in LTC and the community regarding AADR, other complex mental health needs and associated behaviours. In May, in alignment with SGS planning, the NSM LHIN Board of Directors supported an integration motion that will integrate the PRC program from the Collingwood General & Marine Hospital to the NSM SGS program at Waypoint effective October 1, 2017. The Board was in agreement that this integration would be appropriate to ensure these highly skilled consultants continue to provide excellent care as part of an integrated BSS team. Discussions are underway regarding the PRC role as part of the BSS team. In the interim, the PRC role will continue as it currently exists. We will continue to keep our partners apprised of any planned changes.

Central Intake & Referrals

The BSS program is working with the BSS Central Intake team at Waypoint to redesign workflows and resources to continue to improve BSS team response time. There is also work underway to establish a BSS-specific referral form.

Antipsychotic Toolkit Launched

On May 30, 2017 the NSM SGS program's Antipsychotic Toolkit was launched. This toolkit was developed in partnership with the County of Simcoe and the Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre to promote the appropriate use of antipsychotics among NSM long-term care home (LTCH) residents. The toolkit was specifically developed as a resource for interested NSM LTCH prescribers (i.e. physicians, nurse practitioners, pharmacists) but is a useful resource for all health service providers.
